Stand-up is a stool that keeps you fit just like an exercise ball and brings a fun approach to the serious side of life. The design was based on the one-legged milking stool – you sit on it at a slant and it suddenly has three legs. As a result, Stand-up encourages you to swing your hips and let your mind wander in recreational and breakout zones, informal meeting spaces, project and workshop environments, or lobbies and waiting areas. It comes with a practical carry strap to take it from room to room, or perhaps for a spell al fresco.

Stand-up is designed like a child's toy that won't tip over. Given a gentle push, it swings back, but rights itself again – even from an up to 50° angle from the vertical. Its tilted stance when not in use underscores one of its key features: it shows that this attractive item is a dynamic support that moves and not a static stool.

Great for group dynamics and in 9 colours: Stand-up is good fun, particularly when arranged in casual groups. It tempts people to interact with one another and try out a greater range of motion. It puts a smile on the face of everyone, whether it's placed next to lifts, in break-out areas or lobbies.



Its tapered shape resembles an ice-cream cone with a lid. Both the body and cushioned seat are fully covered in three-dimensional fabric. This colourful cover lends Stand-up a highly contemporary look and muffles noise too.

Stand-up now consists of an EPP (expanded polypropylene) hollow body, a steel weight, a damping cylinder and an anti-slip elastomer dome as a base. Weighing just 4.5 kilos it has a strap to take it from room to room, or perhaps for a spell outdoors...



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
